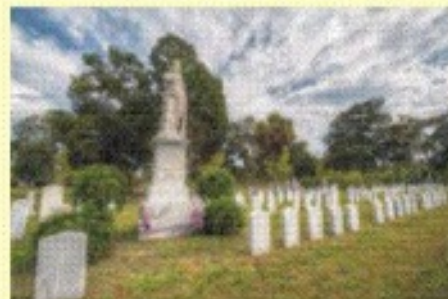

INDEXING MATTERS

Every name that makes their way to the Internet is help others find their ancestors and help their ancestors realize the necessary information in the temple. Because of your efforts in indexing, future records can be made searchable online so that they can be found on both sides of the veil. Here's how the process works.

STEP 1: HISTORICAL RECORDS

What records, census forms, and other important documents are stored in churches and government offices around the world. These are usually handwritten and hard for most people to access.

STEP 2: DIGITAL CONVERSION

Records that have genealogical information are digitally photographed and published on FamilySearch.org. But the names of the people found in the historic documents recorded on the images are still not easily searchable.

DID YOU KNOW?
More than 400,000 volunteers have indexed over 1 billion names.

STEP 4: ONLINE ACCESS

Details from the indexed records are added to a searchable database at FamilySearch.org. The database helps people quickly and easily locate records with important information about their ancestors.

STEP 3: INDEXING

Volunteers like you translate ("index") or type out information from the digital images to make the individual details, the names and dates, searchable. You choose which available project you want to work on, type what you see for each entry, and submit the data—all online. Another person, called an "editor," compares your work for completeness and accuracy.

STEP 5: TEMPLE ORDINANCES

People use the database to find the names of and information about their ancestors. They add this data to their FamilySearch Family Tree and can then make use of the people's temple ordinances as completed.

Getting The Most Information

Population Census Items 1790-2000

(Includes only those supplemental schedules still in existence; excludes questions asked on a sample basis only—the long-form questionnaire.)

1790

Name of family head; free white males of 16 years and up; free white males under 16; free white females; slaves; other free persons.

1800

Names of family head; if white, age and sex; race, slaves.

1810

Name of family head; if white, age and sex; race; slaves.

1820

Name of family head; age; sex; race; foreigners not naturalized; slaves; industry (agriculture, commerce, and manufactures).

1830

Name of family head; age; sex; race; foreigners not naturalized; slaves; industry.

1840

Name of family head; age; sex; race; slaves; number of deaf and dumb; number of blind; number of insane and idiotic and whether in public or private charge; number of persons in each family employed in each of six classes of industry and one of occupation; literacy; pensioners for Revolutionary or military service.

Address; name; relationship to family head; sex; race; age; marital status; number of years of present marriage for women, number of children born and number now living; birthplace and mother tongue of person and parents; if foreign born, year of immigration, whether naturalized, and whether able to speak English, or if not, language spoken; occupation, industry, and class of worker; if an employee, whether out of work during year; literacy; school attendance; home owned or rented; if owned, whether mortgaged; whether farm or house; whether a survivor of Union or Confederate Army or Navy; whether blind or deaf and dumb.

1920

Address; name; relationship to family head; sex; race; age; marital status; if foreign born, year of immigration to the U.S., whether naturalized, and year of naturalization; school attendance; literacy; birthplace of person and parents; mother tongue of foreign born; ability to speak English; occupation, industry, and class of worker; home owned or rented; if owned, whether free or mortgaged.

1930

Address; name; relationship to family head; home owned or rented; value or monthly rental; radio set; whether on a farm; sex; race; age; marital status; age at first marriage; school attendance; literacy; birthplace of person and parents; if foreign-born language spoken in home before coming to U.S., year of immigration, whether naturalized, and ability to speak English; occupation, industry, and class of worker; whether at work previous day (or last regular working day); veteran status; for Indians, whether of full or mixed blood, and tribal affiliation.

1940

Address; home owned or rented; value or monthly rental; whether on a farm; name; relationship to household head; sex; race; age; marital status; school attendance; educational attainment; birthplace; citizenship of foreign born; location of residence 5 years ago and whether on a farm; employment status; if at work, whether in private or nonemergency government work, or in public emergency work (WPA, CCC, NYA, etc.); if in private work, hours worked in week; if seeking work or on public emergency work, duration of unemployment; occupation, industry, and class of worker; weeks worked last year; income last year.

1950

Address; whether house is on farm; name; relationship to household head; race; sex; age; marital status; birthplace if foreign born, whether naturalized; employment status; hours worked in week; occupation, industry, and class of worker.

1960-1970

Address; name; relationship to household head; sex; race; age; marital status.

1980-1990

Address; name; household relationship; sex; race; age; marital status; Spanish/Hispanic origin or descent.

2000

Address; home owned or rented; name; household relationship; sex; age; birth date; race; Spanish/Hispanic/Latino origin or descent.

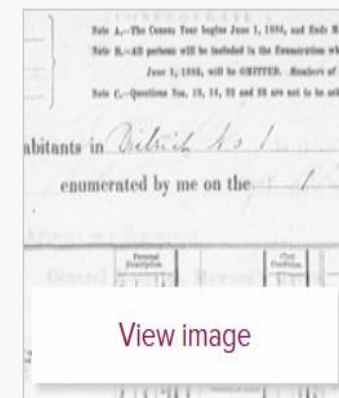

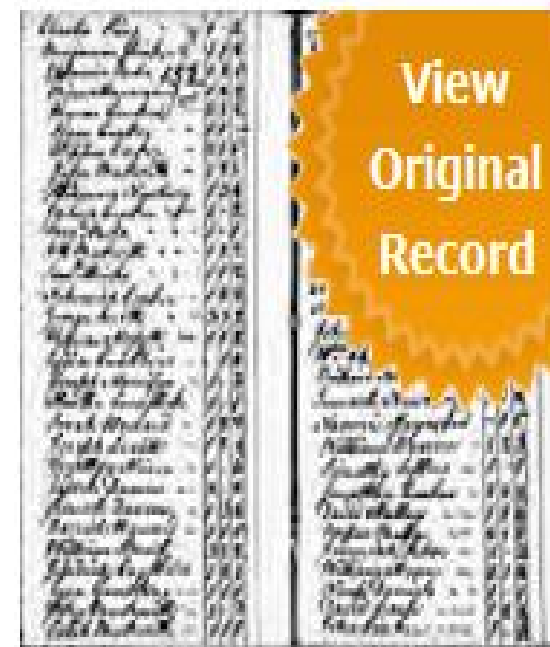

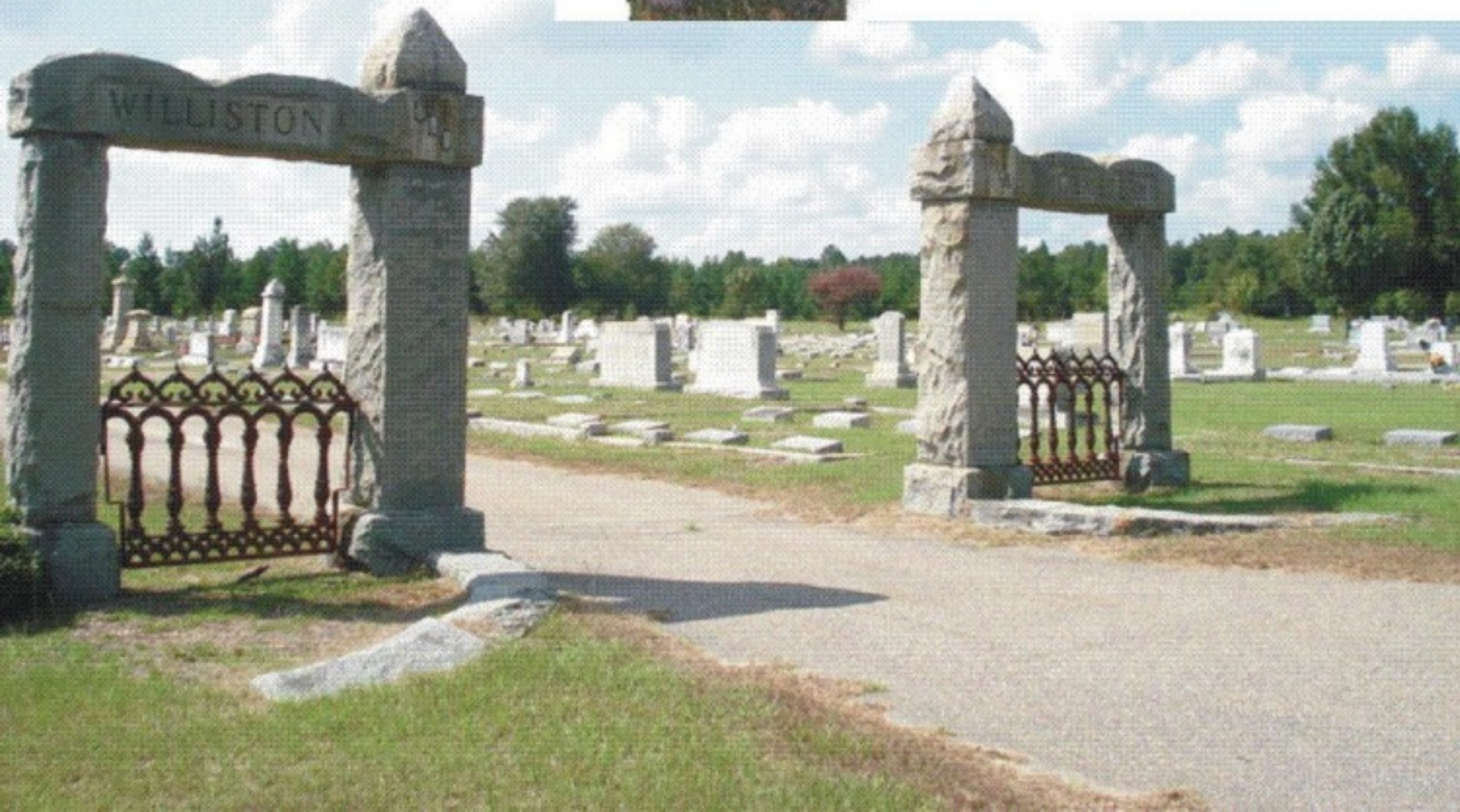

The Columbarium



The Columbarium at Black Mountain Presbyterian Church was begun as a part of our most recent building addition in 1993. The Session decreed that the Columbarium could not be a “moneymaking” operation of the Church. The committee reports to the Session via the Property Ministry Team.

Presently the Columbarium is comprised of three Niche Units (A, B, and C) with a total of 224 Niches, and one Plaque Unit (P) with 56

Plaques. As of November 1, 2012, there is one Niche each in Units B and C that are not subscribed and only 15 of 80 in Unit A that are subscribed. Plaque Unit P has 45 of 56 spaces subscribed. There is room for expansion. Niche units B and C, \$200 per niche; Niche unit A, \$400 per niche, Plaque unit P, \$100 per space. Niche units A, B, and C are for the storage of cremains. Plaque unit P is for those who are interred elsewhere but wish to be remembered at Black Mountain Presbyterian Church.

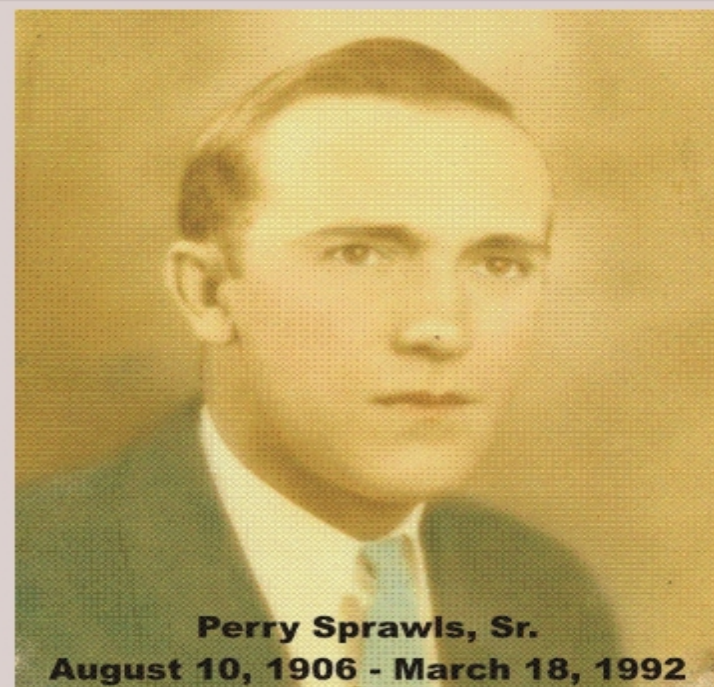

It was still owned and operated by the Sprawls Family in 2012, after 200 years. Perry inherited the farm in the 1930s and operated it for many years. The house on the farm was built in 1856 and escaped being burned by the Union Army because here was someone ill in the house. All of the farm buildings were burned. This was witnessed by his father, Richard Sprawls, a young boy at the time, who always remembered the soldiers stole his pony. In 1932 a young nurse, Neva Ione Mathis, from Augusta, GA came to the farm to provide care for Perry's mother at the end of her life. Neva and Perry were married in 1933. Because of his interest in providing quality education he served as a school trustee for many years. First in the 1930s, for the small one-room and one-teacher Tinkers Creek School near the farm and then the consolidated Williston-Elko District until 1957, when his youngest child, Emily, graduated. For many years he operated three farms with melons, peanuts and cotton as the major crops. The home farm also included a dairy

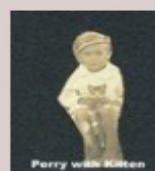

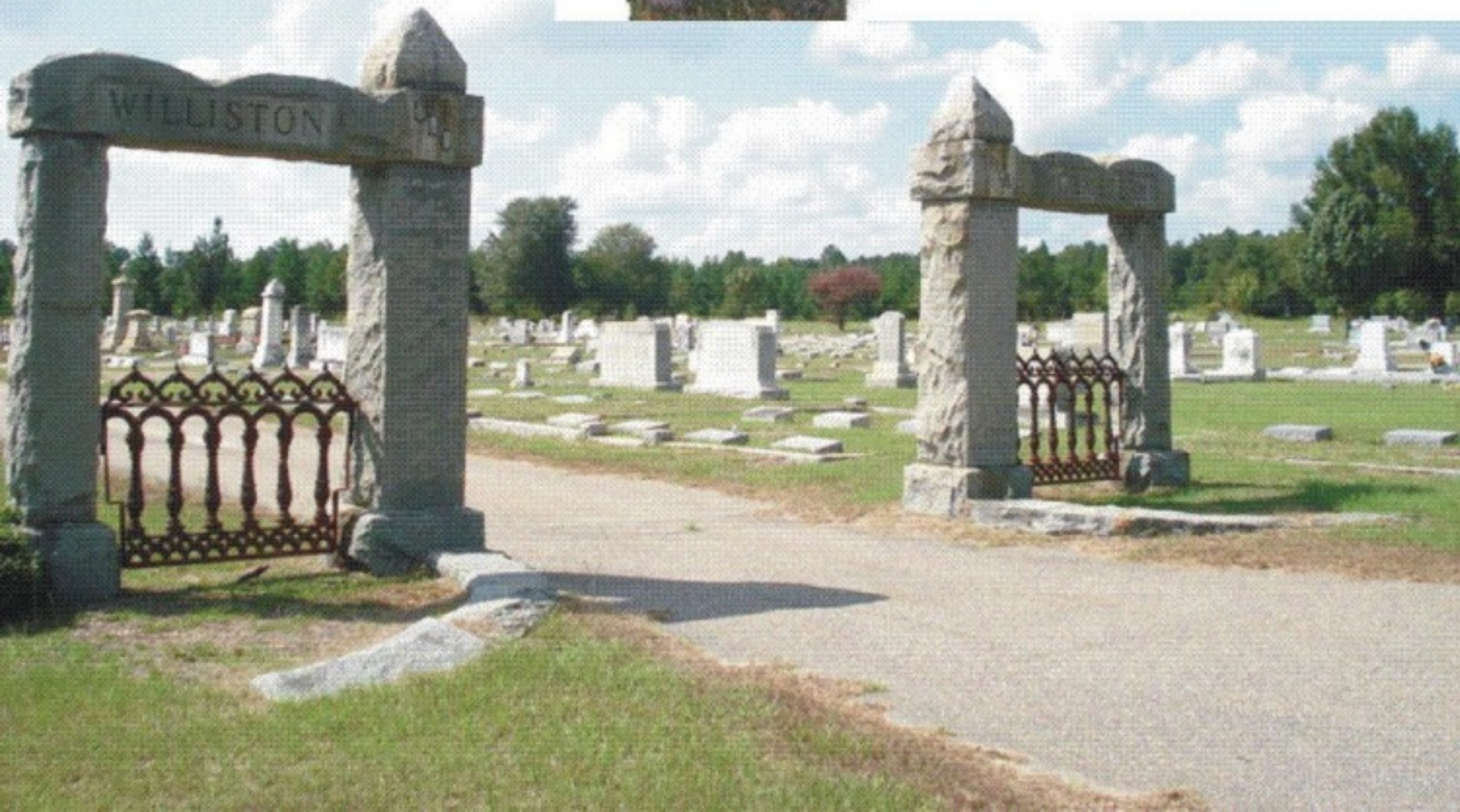

DNA is found in every cell in your body except red blood cells. The nucleus of cells contain chromosomes, and chromosomes are coiled up DNA. (In other words, chromosomes are DNA.) Humans have a total of 46 chromosomes, which are grouped into pairs. Each of the 23 pair consists of one chromosome from our mother and one from our father. In females the 23rd chromosome pair consists of two X-chromosomes. Males, however, have an X-chromosome and a Y-chromosome. Therefore, it is the Y-chromosome that determines male gender.

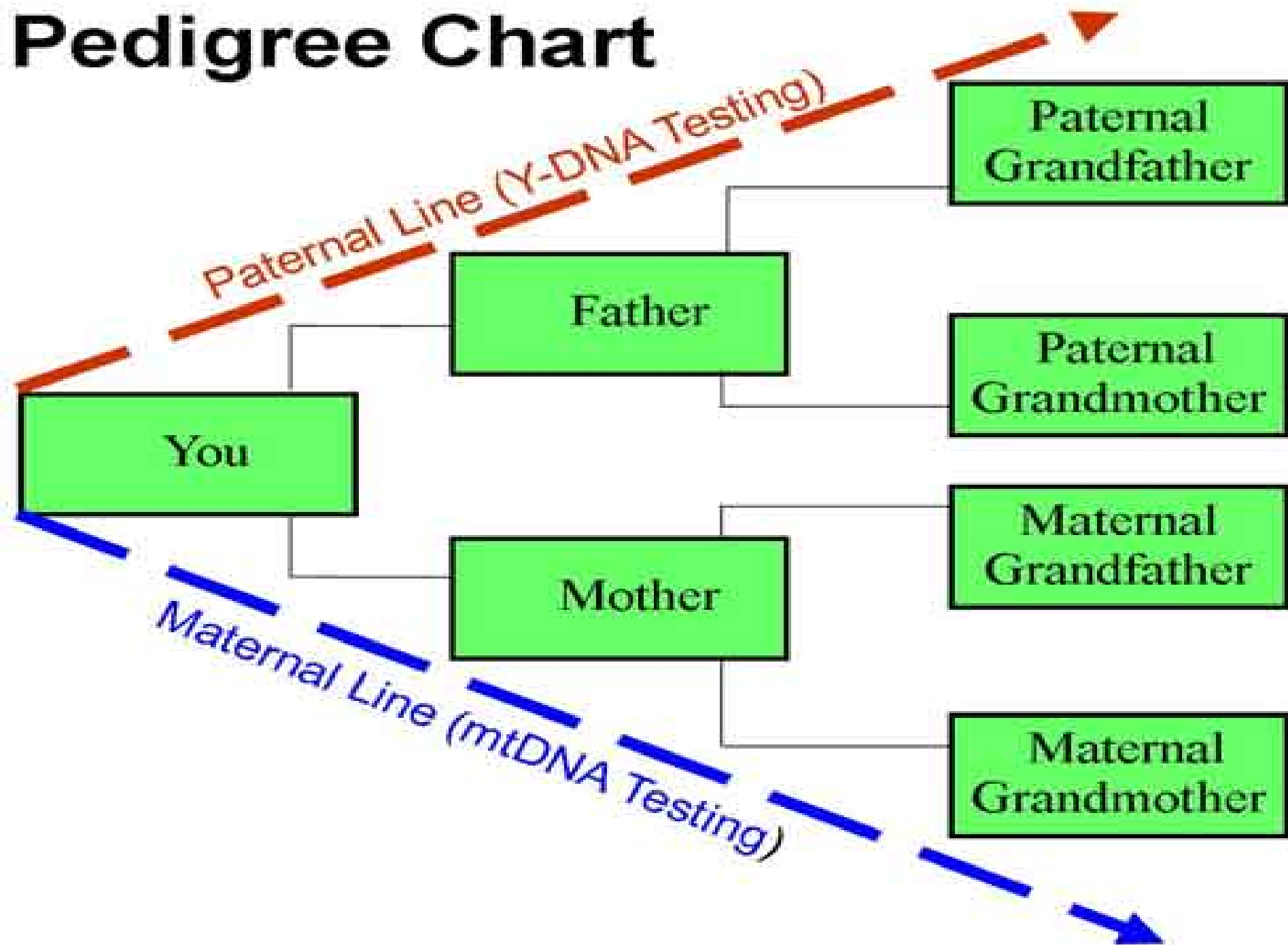

Dominant Y-DNA Haplogroups in Europe by Country

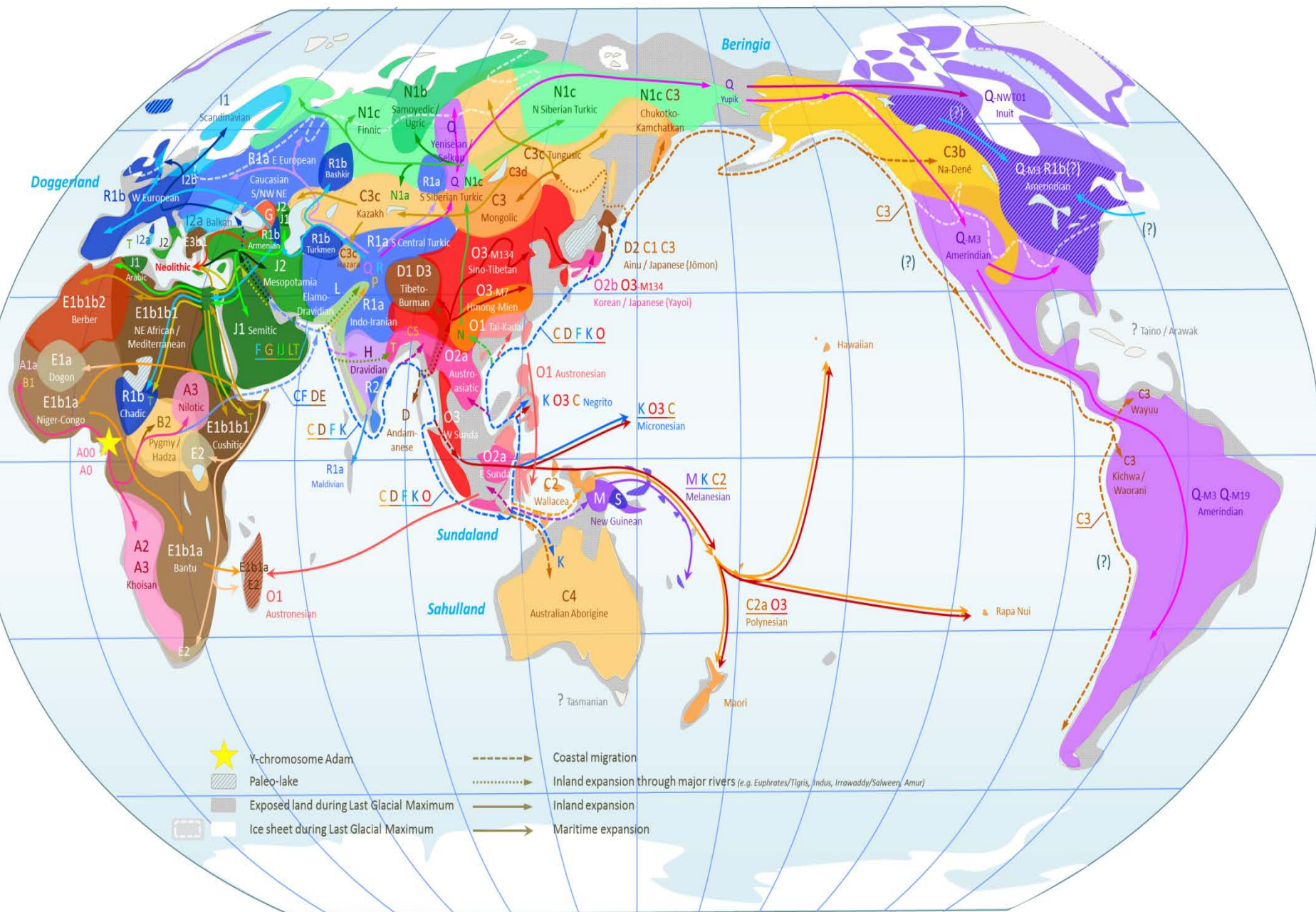
